Election of Church Officer Nominating Committee

Put in God's Hands

Election of Church Officer Nominating Committee

A. The Church Officer Nominating Committee shall consist of nine voting members.

B. The Church Officer Nominating Committee shall be chosen each year at the annual Congregational Meeting ordinarily held the second week of February and will serve until a new committee is elected. No member of the Nominating Committee shall serve more than three years consecutively. It shall ordinarily consist of the following people.

1. Two Elders designated by and from the outgoing class of the Session. One of these persons shall be named by the Session as Moderator of the Church Officer Nominating Committee, and the other as Vice-Moderator. *(Virginia Holloway, Harold Keegan and Marti Kent have been designated for 2015.)*

2. One woman designated by the Presbyterian Women's Coordinating Team. *(Blanche Hamilton has been designated for 2015.)*

3. One youth designated by the Student Ministry Team.

4. One person from the current Church Officer Nominating Committee designated by the current Church Officer Nominating Committee. *(David Bradford as chair of the 2014 Committee.)*

5. Four persons from the congregation-at-large elected at the annual Congregational Meeting. After noting the other five persons named, these persons should include fair representation from both sexes, racial ethnic members, all age groups, and persons representing major activities of the church, none of whom may be in active service on the Session.

6. All nominees shall be contacted prior to the meeting to determine their willingness to serve, if elected.

7. The Pastor shall be an ex-officio, non-voting member of the committee.

8. All groups making designations for the Church Officer Nominating Committee shall report their designee to the Clerk of the Session by the December stated meeting. The designees shall be reported to the congregation with the announcement at the annual Congregational Meeting.

9. When the number of nominees equals the number of Church Officer Nominating Committee members to be elected, the congregation may vote by voice vote or show of hands. When the number of nominees is greater than the numbers of Elders to be elected, the congregation shall vote by secret ballot. A majority of all the voters present and voting shall be required to elect.

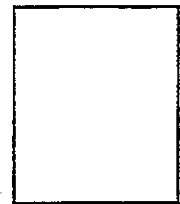
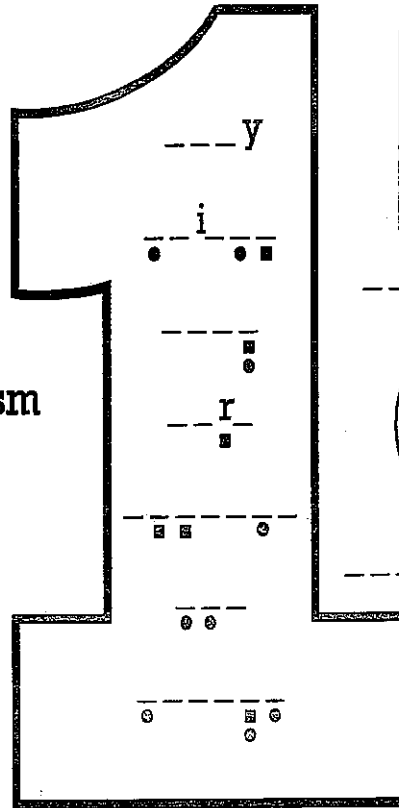

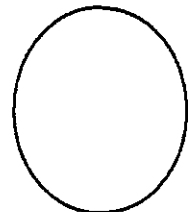
