Lee Bruner's Mission Trip

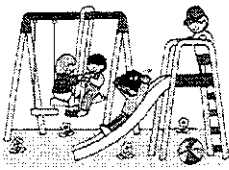
Lee Bruner, an ear-nose-and-throat doctor and elder at Broadmoor Presbyterian, spent 10 days treating Guatemalans who live in extreme poverty. "It was my first mission trip and the way I found it was providential," said Bruner, explaining that he heard a visiting physician speak to the ENT Medical Society and read in his resume about the Guatemalan mission. He became interested, researched, and applied, a long procedure that began last December. Bruner was the only Baton Rougean in a group of 30 who flew from Houston on May 16 to Guatemala City for a week-long experience. "It was only a one and a half hour flight," said Bruner.

"Getting through customs with medical supplies, mostly donated, took time," he said. "The next morning, we rode four hours on a bus into the countryside to a hospital, Halario Galindo, located near Retalhuleu, a city of 40,000, nicknamed Reu. We worked 12-hour days."

The most challenging surgery he did was the removal of an unusual tumor in the cheek of a teen-age girl. "Overall, I did 15 surgical procedures and 60 consultations." His team of physicians did nearly 80 surgical procedures and over 100 consultations. The non-profit mission is part of Faith in Practice, an ecumenical Christian project with some 800 vol-

unteers annually. "Most on our team were from Texas, and were led by Dr. Phil Johnson and his wife, Linda. "I, also, became good friends with my translator, Dr. Sylvia Rucinos, a pediatrician, and her husband, Dr. Otoniel Rucinos, a surgeon. Their practice is in Guatemala City. Bruner advises anyone taking the mission trip to be prepared mentally for the culture shock. "You have to be flexible," he said, "and they work at a slower pace than we do. There is so much to be done, and we could not hope to do more than help in a small way, one individual at a time. "Personally, the mission team was housed and fed well, but the Guatemalans are very poor."

Carl Renfroe's Memorial

The life of longtime member of Broadmoor Presbyterian, Carl Andrew Renfroe, age 79, was celebrated Saturday, May 23, at St. John's United Methodist Church on Highland Road. Carl was an elder and active in the life of the church until he became ill, and Kris joined St. John's United Methodist Church in October, 2014, due to its proximity to their home and regular visits of the pastor, the Rev. Dr. Jay Hogewood.

Since Carl donated his body to science, the service was a memorial, upbeat in nature, as noted organist Terry Byars played the organ, including the U.S. Navy hymn, "Eternal Father Strong to Save," in recognition of Carl's service in the Navy and Memorial Day. At BPC, Carl was active in missions, tutoring, Sunday School and was happy to do whatever was needed. He and Kris worked together.

Brooke Renfroe of Atlanta, their daughter, and Rob Renfroe, of Houston, gave eulogies with stories of their father's devotion to them, his lessons in learning and life, and his devotion to their mother. "He was her biggest fan," said Rob. In her stories, Brooke told how he wrapped packages so totally that she could not always open them and evoked laughter when she told step by step of his wrapping process. Whatever he did was thorough, both children said.

The pastor told of the meaning of Jesus' life and how Carl exemplified the Christian life in his own. Lunch fare was served at the reception prior to the service, and, afterward, the group was invited to the Renfroe home nearby. A number of Albemarle employees, who worked with Carl at Ethyl Corp., prior to it becoming Albemarle, attended, along with members from Broadmoor Presbyterian Church.

C G & T Wrap-Up

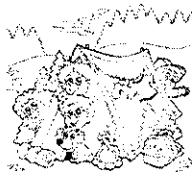

THE ORIGINS OF FATHER'S DAY! One Sunday in 1909, Sonora Smart Dodd listened to a sermon honoring mothers. Her mother had died some years before, so her father had raised her by himself. Dodd wondered why there wasn't a day to honor fathers, so she arranged a tribute to her father at a church in Spokane, Washington. The date was June 19, 1910. Many people believe this was the beginning of Father's Day.



Another account holds that a West Virginia church held a tribute service for fathers in 1908, following a mine explosion that killed 360 men. Regardless of which story is correct, President Calvin Coolidge was the first president to designate a special day to honor fathers. In 1924, he proclaimed the third Sunday in June as Father's Day.

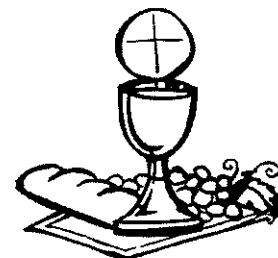
