“The Aroma of God” by Pat Freshney

Where do we smell, see, and experience the “aroma” of God? This was in our Bible study lesson in the Presbyterian Women’s circles in February, and I thought of it all that week. The word “aroma” brought to mind a long ago car trip with Bill and our three daughters.

We were returning to Louisiana from northern Kentucky, a 900 mile trip. My sweet mother-in-law had made a big batch of fried chicken

for our supper, so we could just eat in our motel that evening. She made the BEST fried chicken ever—better than KFC, Popeye’s, or Church’s. The aroma filled our big station wagon. It was overwhelming.



We all convinced ourselves that there was no really good lunch place to stop, south of Louisville, KY. Two hours after leaving, about 10:30, we took a vote and ate our supper, every bit of it, at 10:30 in the morning. The aroma had been so wonderful. I’m sure the whole trip was happier because of it. We knew it had been prepared with loving hands.

I’m pretty sure it had the aroma of Christ. Aroma and aura, I think, are closely related. The song says, “They will know we are Christians by our love.” Do they know we are Christians by our love? I think so.

The real Christians I have known definitely had that “aroma” or aura. It had a lot to do with the love they had for each person they met. I hope our church has an “aroma” that people who visit can feel.

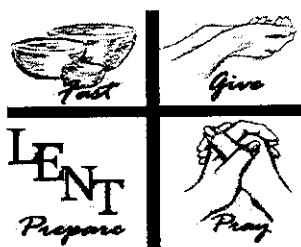
Mom Freshney was one of those people who radiated her Christianity—you just knew she really cared. She had actually lost her mother as a child, and helped raise four younger brothers. And she’d had a handicapped child of her own—a tiny woman, but God gave her the strength to be a loving friend to everyone she met.

Other “aromas” - the pine of the mountains, the fresh salt air of the ocean—that always seems very spiritual to me. God has given special places where an actual aroma makes us feel closer to Him.

**Birdwatcher-Educator
to Speak to CGTs
March 25**

Jane Patterson, president of the Baton Rouge Audubon Society, was an amateur birdwatcher several years ago, who suddenly became aware of the birds all around her, and wanted to know more about them. Dedicated now to educating others, she will address the Chronologically Gifted and Talented at noon Wednesday, March 25. Chairwoman E. J. McCune said the catered luncheon is open to church members and friends.

The speaker, also chairwoman of the Society's education committee, started a Kids Who Bird Club for youngsters ages 9-16, who meet monthly and take regular field trips. Due to her own experiences, she focuses on bird education, the hot spots where they gather, and the best ways to attract, and to feed, them. She teaches a leisure class at LSU, leads tours in Bluebonnet Swamp and other area places, as well as throughout the state, including Cameron Parish.

The Advocate has featured her several times, the most recent on February 25 by C. J. Futch. In a story in January, 2013, Kyle Peveto told of

what she termed her "a ha moment." She said, "I lived here 25 years before I noticed a white ibis. This is not a dinky bird. It stands two feet tall and is all around us." The non-profit Society literature states that Louisiana has over 300 species of birds. Patterson networks with other birders and described the sensation of holding a tiny hummingbird in her hand. The Society partners with the Louisiana Bird Observatory; Eric Johnson is a co-director and also vice president of the Audubon Society.

Fee is \$10 each, payable at the door, but reservations are due by noon, March 23. The menu will be announced later.

ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES will meet at 9:30 a.m. each Sunday. You are invited to join one of the classes listed below.

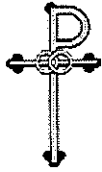

The congregation is invited to our Good Friday Service at 12:00 noon on April 3 in the Sanctuary.

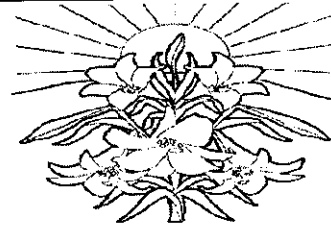


"The Seven Last Words of Christ" is the theme.
