We were in our first little house—a wonderful home, with even a playhouse for our two little girls, ages two and four. It was in an older but nice suburb in Cincinnati. It was in the early fifties, before integration. A black lady moved into the house across the street. No one in the neighborhood minded her living there, but everyone was worried about the property values going down. Actually, the lady was a very nice person. She also had her PhD. She also had a gardener and a housekeeper, which none of us could afford.



One day, her little niece had come to visit.

There were no other young children on our street but our two. Our Pam and the little visitor across the street looked wistfully at each other for a while—both too young to cross the street alone. Finally, I went over to see if they could play, and the aunt asked if Pam could come over

there and play. The little girls had a wonderful time playing that morning.

When Pam came home, she talked all about what fun they’d had. I didn’t think Pam had ever seen a black person before and, finally, my curiosity got the best of me, and I asked her if she noticed anything “different”? My four-year-old daughter thought for a minute and then replied, “Oh Mama—they have an upstairs!!!” Sometimes, an innocent child can teach us so much!

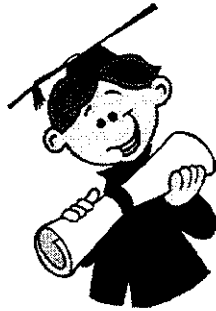


Points of Interest From the Session

“There’s a good reason they call these ceremonies ‘commencement exercises,’” Utah Senator Orrin Hatch once said. “Graduation is not the end; it’s the beginning.” The same is true of baptism. A Prayer for Mom



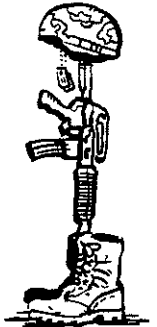
A young boy had been misbehaving, so his mother sent him to his room.
